# What makes a good inquiry teacher?

The majority of adults in our community attended traditional style school, and so they may not be completely familiar with what goes on in our UDIS classrooms. People may wonder how exactly learning happens if the teacher does not lead a whole class lesson. To answer this kind of wondering, I have listed some of the characteristics of a good inquiry teacher. The teacher normally spends a lot of the time sitting among the students, at their level. There is a physical closeness that allows the teacher to be involved in the learning activities.

The inquiry teacher asks more than they tell. They encourages the students to think deeply and engage in meaningful conversation.

Time is given to simple experimenting and trying to find what works. This takes more time than giving an answer.


A good teacher sees the student as having prior knowledge and and being curious. We do not see students as empty vessels to be filled with knowledge. We want to know what they already understand and then we can assist them in building on that prior knowledge

The teacher has many strategies for engaging students in thinking. There is a lot of respect for discussion and expression of thoughts.

We guide the students in finding ways to answer the guestions that are important to them

A good inquiry teacher does not hesitate to say the words, "I don't know. I guess I need to find out."

As you ponder on these points you will begin to understand how teaching and learning operates in our classrooms. The diagram gives a simple illustration of how the inquiry process often works.

#### Preschool class update - Busy Bees

We have many busy weeks behind us. Every week we have been focusing on a particular topic and making connections to it in all areas of learning. We looked at our amazing body and learned English words for body parts through songs, games and art projects. We also made connections to healthy eating habits and made our own healthy face snacks. During mathematics we counted in English up to 10 and learned to recognise some 2D shapes: a circle, a square, a triangle, a star and basic colours. We are very proud of our young students, who did very well in a range of group activities such as sorting socks/ plastic balls according to their colour, finding the letters 's' and 'a', making playdough of different colours, participating in the provocation 'Brush, brush your teeth', 'Sing along!', dancing with ribbons, apple vinegar soda science experiment, art projects (clay art, face collages, collaborative painting, fruit stamping), story time etc. Last week we started our exploration of the sense of touch, and we aim to cover all 5 senses during the following weeks (seeing, hearing, smelling, tasting, and touching). The students will participate in different play based and adult led activities that will help them to explore how our senses work, and what kinds of information they tell us.














#### Primary Years Update

We bought some fruit and vegetables and brought them back to have a party at school to celebrate the end of our Unit of Inquiry about always trying to make healthy choices for our lifestyle. We had great fun and learned how to read labels on packets of food at the supermarket. Our math skills are improving and we can now add two numbers that have zero in the units space. We are also getting better at counting on to solve addition problems, as well as counting on to solve subtraction questions. Using a ruler to measure many different small items is the new skill we are working on. We have started to use adjectives when we write our sentences. Our phonics knowledge is growing and we are all busily reading at home every night, which helps to improve our reading.

The next parent cafe is Monday 2 October with the Early Years Team. Please mark it on your calendar. It will be a very informative session.









