#### Dear Parents

Last week, I had the chance to attend the latest International School's Association of Thailand (ISAT) meeting in Bangkok. These meetings bring together all 120+ members from the best international schools across Thailand. This is a great chance to learn about issues that affect international schools and network with other school members in Thailand.

At this meeting, our guest speaker was Mr. Teerakiat Jaroensettasin, the Deputy Minister of Education who discussed the topic of "Ministry of Education Policy on International School Education." I have to say, from being involved in education for many years in Thailand, that Mr



Jaroensettasin was incredibly refreshing and has some great ideas for the reform of education in Thailand. He acknowledged that Thai public schools are failing by almost every measure. In contrast, international schools in Thailand is where the best education is happening. He intends to bring down barriers that affect international school's ability to educate while working to improve the Thai public education system. I for one, wish him the best in trying to achieve these goals.

While in Bangkok I also had the chance to attend the Communication Friendly Spaces Approach seminar by Elizabeth Jarman, a UK based practitioner who has pioneered this approach. The key learning from this was that our school's environment needs to reflect our pedagogy. We will be working hard to make changes to our environment to provide support for inquiry at the school.

Finally, we conducted our latest PTA meeting on Monday 16 May. At this meeting, we sought to consult with parents around the future directions of the school. The main directions parents would like the school to focus on are, in order of popularity:

- 1. Building development and resources
- 2. Arts, music, drama, sports and PE
- 3. Practical subjects and student safety
- 4. Human resources
- 5. Technology and culture




#### Yearbook 2015/2016 advertising
