Preschool class update - Welcome Back To School!

We are very excited about our new Unit of Inquiry 'How we organise ourselves' with the Central Idea 'People play different roles in the communities to which they belong'. Over the coming weeks, students will be looking into the various communities we belong to and how those communities are organised into the roles of the people who help us and why they are important for us. During our first week, preschool students were provided an insight into the unit through talking about people who help us at home and in our community. We also used our role play area to act out how we help our parents at home. The other focus during this week was learning skills for recognising and making patterns. This went really well with combining some Halloween motives: the preschool students enjoyed 'planting their own pumpkins' (making pumpkin patterns) and 'gathering the pumpkin harvest' (sorting the pumpkins).

Our preschoolers love music, singing, dance and movement. So far, popular songs in Preschool are 'The ABC Song', 'The Wheels on the BUS' and 'Five Little Monkeys.' We will be adding new songs to our Classroom Music Box soon! We are looking forward to sharing further updates with you! Our new learning journey has just begun and it promises to be very exciting!



Year 1 class update - Mix N Match By Ms Karyn Scrimgeour, Year 1 Teacher

Our first Unit of Inquiry drew to a close and the students produced some excellent summative assessment projects. We made mix and match booklets using caricature pictures they chose and students wrote statements about themselves to go with each page. The Unit was designed so students would inquire into themselves, including: how they look, what they can do and the things they like, as well as identifying things they were good at or things they struggled with. The students also made "All My Stripes" Zebras inspired by the book on which they place statements about themselves. They also mirrored this activity in Thai using Tigers.

The students made a lot of connections and on a basic level were able to identify that they are more willing to do things that they enjoy doing or are good at. This is an excellent foundation for the students beginning to understand themselves and how they learn best, creating independent and enthusiastic learners.




Year 4 class update-Our Diverse Class is Ready to Learn! By Ms Rebecca Kehn, Y4 Teacher

The year four students are enthusiastic to be back in school following the half term break. During this short week back, we participated in a ceremony to honour His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej. We also spent some time learning about His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej, and the wonderful life of service he led. In addition, students culminated their last Unit of Inquiry by presenting their final group projects on a body system. They were asked explain and show how that body system works, how the system is connected to other systems and how we can take care of our bodies. We were very proud of their efforts and learning in this Unit, and are excited to move on to our new Unit of Inquiry. We will be exploring the Where we are in Place and Time and the central idea: The Earth's physical geography has an impact on human interactions and settlements. In the coming weeks students will be exploring the diversity of the planet and questions such as, "Why do people live where they live?". In Maths, we are working with written addition and solving word problems involving addition. We continue to work on our language skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking. We will be commencing homework next week with regular reading time, spelling and occasional math. Each of our students are beginning to show growth in various areas, and it has been exciting for our team to watch them grow, as well as to continue to get to know each of them. In only a short ten weeks, we have developed into a quirky, fun, and diverse group. We enjoy spending our days together learning, exploring, and having fun. We also welcomed a new student to our year four class, Tanawan Saoirse Lahiff. She has already effortlessly blended into our wonderful, dynamic group, and has brought her own unique personality as well as her strengths and talents. Welcome Saoirse! The students' enthusiasm for learning puts a smile on my face everyday. Whatever we are up to, Maths, English, UOI...they are always ready to learn!

If you ever have health or safety concerns about the school, please inform us so we can take action.






House Update
