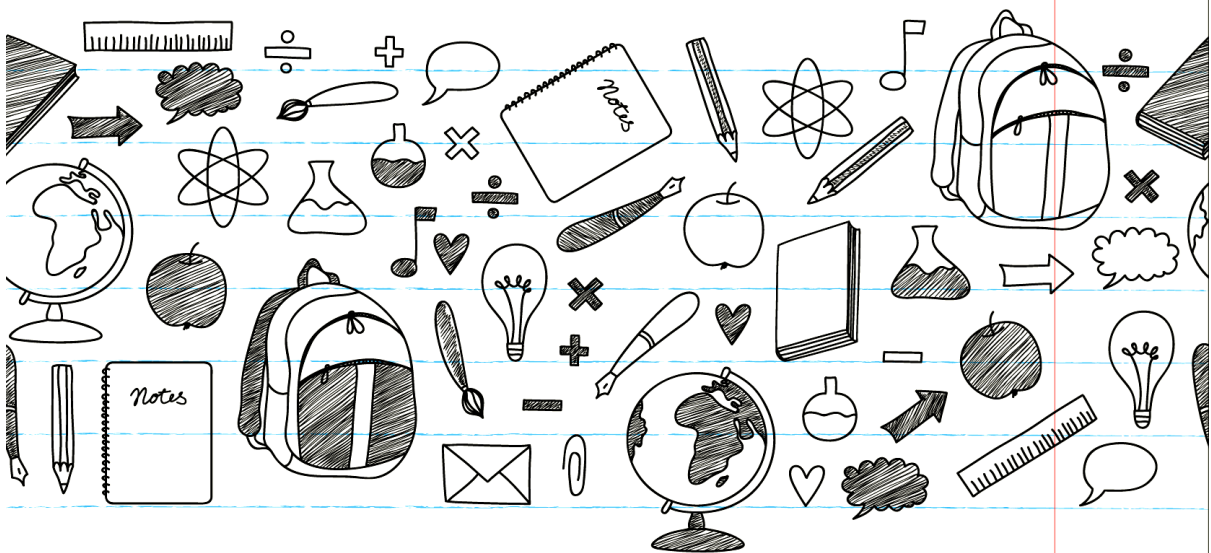

Inquiry corner

When planning for our Units of Inquiry, we work backwards. So as a group of teachers we look at what the central idea is (e.g. from Year 1 we were looking at how homes reflect cultural influences and local conditions). We then look to see what we think that means to us and how we can explain it to the students. Then we come up with what is called the summative assessment (the final task to show what they have learned). For the recent Year 1 unit, they had choices for how they could do the summative assessment around building their own house and finding an artifact that would go with the house that would show off its cultural traits. Then we plan activities that will lead the class to that summative assessment. We do activities that are relevant to the aim of the unit and which build the skills the students will need to complete the final task. So for the Year 1 class, they designed houses, and then drew streets on a map. They were then able to compare houses, read books about houses and even watch videos about different kind of houses around the world.

If you are interested to see how a Unit is run, please feel free to check in with your homeroom teacher. They have a lot of information they can share about the process.

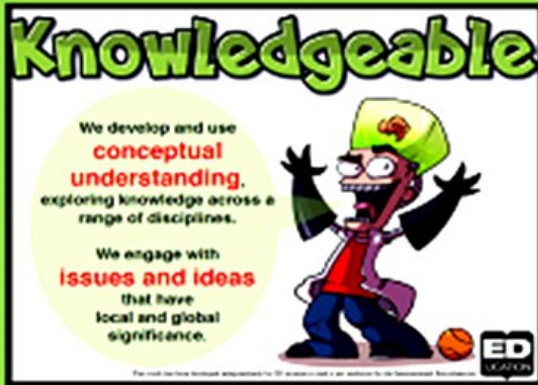

Students have begun to explore different types of transport need for different areas and have designed their own vehicles. We are continuing from previous units to make a Year 1 World Atlas and are filling it with the information we learn. We are having lots of fun with Mathematics too as students practice and master a variety of skills from counting to measuring.



Year 4 class update

The Songkran Festival was a great way to finish Term 2. Several of the Year 4 girls participated in the Thai dancing demonstration with Mrs. Sapanyok and did a great job. Students also completed their summative assessment focussing on how the earth, atmosphere and humans are impacted by natural changes such as earthquakes and tsunamis. The pop up books they created were very thorough with great illustrations to reinforce the information on each page. Student led conferences were very well done and provided parents with some great feedback. As we begin Term 3, students will focus on communication through signs and symbols in our UOI. They will also create a classroom map as an individual project and as a group they will create a large floor map of the school. In Mathematics we have been working diligently on division and problem solving. Students continue to work on improving their reading and writing skills. In English, two pieces of formal writing will be assigned this term. Students are currently learning how to use a framework to plan a recount (retelling of an event). They will follow all steps of the writing process to then publish a good copy. The second piece of formal writing will be a short narrative story.



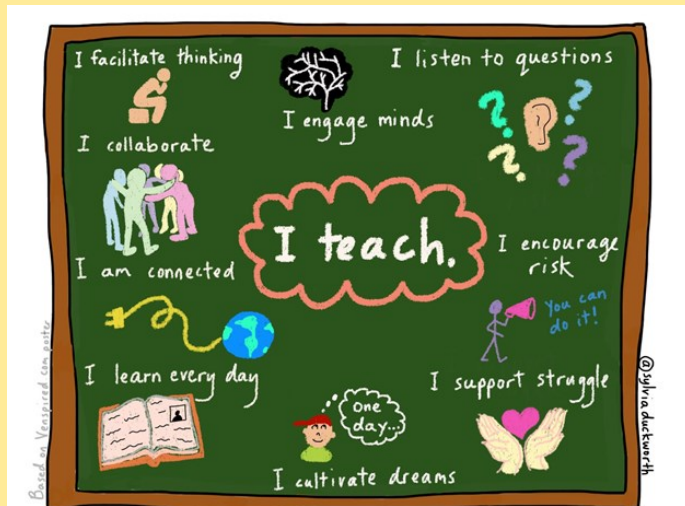
Finally, we are brainstorming ideas for a fun end of year trip. Keep up the excellent work Year 4!

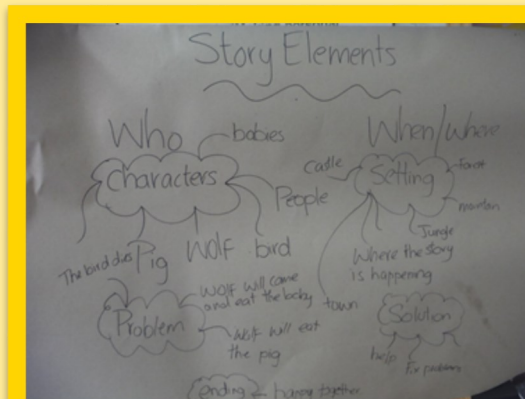
English as an additional language (EAL)

As May is approaching soon, our testing sessions will start where we measure students on their reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills.

This month students have been learning about story elements. We focused on who, where, when, how, and why questions.

We have been working on our “prior knowledge”

- Listen to a YouTube Clip that is about the elements in a story. [Parts of a Story Song](#)
- Once the clip is over, review the elements. Have the students engage in a brief discussion to define each element. (check for understanding with each):
- Characters: the people in the story (who)
- Setting: where and when the story takes place (where, when)
- Problem: what went/is wrong within the story (what)
- Solution: how the problem is fixed/solved (how)

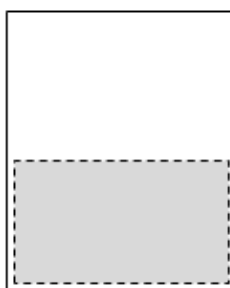
