

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# Message from the Head of School

Dear Parents

This week, I wanted to share with you a summary from the PYP report generated from the visit of our PYP Consultant, Miss Maike Silver. The report is based on assessment of our readiness for authorisation. Each different standard and practice was rated as either not evident, emerging or evident. This is summarised in the following table:



	Not evident (No planning, no evidence, a lot of support required)	Emerging (Some planning, some evidence, some support required)	Evident (Planning in place, evidence available, well understood by school)
Standard A: Philosophy	0 standards	6 standards	14 standards
Standard B: Organisation	0 standards	6 standards	33 standards
Standard C: Curriculum	1 standard	4 standards	9 standards
Total	1 standard	16 standards	56 standards

The overall recommendation from Maike was that the school was not yet ready to submit for authorisation. However the table shows that we are making good progress towards authorisation in the 2018/2019 academic year with almost all standards in place with evidence available.

Finally, on Friday 19 May, we held our third, and final, Executive Board Meeting of the year. At this meeting the school budget for the 2017/2018 academic year was approved. The Board also approved a 6% school fees increase for 2017/2018 but asked that parents be consulted about this before confirming this. So, at the next PTA meeting (Wednesday 7 June) we will explain how this fee increase is made up and the rationale for it. The Board also approved changes to the Board Charter and other rules to ensure the Head of School was held accountable to the Board. Lastly, the Board looked at a proposed plan for developing a boarding school and a further expansion of the school's facilities. More work needs to be done to identify demand for this proposal and also the source of investment monies.



Mr Don did a wonderful job having multiple teachers teach students about different topics. The students played games and earned house points for the assemblies they attended and participated in.












# House Update

Across the whole year we also worked on an English Handbook for the Udon Thani Provincial Organisation and we completed printing this and delivered a workshop for local English teachers.




