#### Inquiry corner

In the previous issue, our learner attitudes were shared. These are attitudes we model as teachers and we work towards developing them in our students. In the next few issues the importance of these will be discussed. Each of them relates closely to inquiry style learning. In this article, creativity and independence will be explored.

Creativity - Quite often this is thought of in relation to the arts. The Primary Years Programme at UDIS involves students in being creative, not only in the arts, but in academic study too. Teachers encourage students to explore creative solutions to their work. For example, in mathematics students are expected to engage with mathematical problems and find creative ways of solving them. Students are allowed time to discover their own ways of thinking through mathematical problems, and then the traditional method for solving them is shared when the students have had time to involve themselves deeply in exploring strategies. In this way, creativity of thought is developed and students may take ownership of their learning. They are praised when they are able to show creative ways of working through challenges.

The ability to think creatively goes hand in hand with independence. Students are encouraged to give some independent thought to tasks before asking for support. Some amount of independent thought is necessary in learning and students feel proud when they are able to work things out for themselves. Naturally, the teacher is working with the students to keep them focussed.

Creativity and independence are just two attitudes which are encouraged in inquiry style learning. Students who display these will be encouraged to develop these attitudes and put them into practice in their learning tasks.

#### Community Service at UDIS

Our students were very proud and happy on Tuesday 30 January as we donated things in need to students from the Northeastern Welfare Center for the Mentally Retarded Udon Thani Province. The Student Council has led fund-raising activities which have included Movie Night and our Christmas Bazaar to provide sportswear and school supplies to the students from this center. Our students have learned about generosity, doing good activities for others and social responsibility. Thank you everybody who has supported this great project.


#### Health and Safety
