










	family, reading, cryptocurrencies, gardening and he has a strong interest in Buddhist philosophy.
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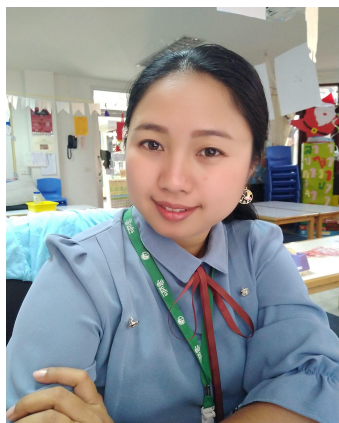
