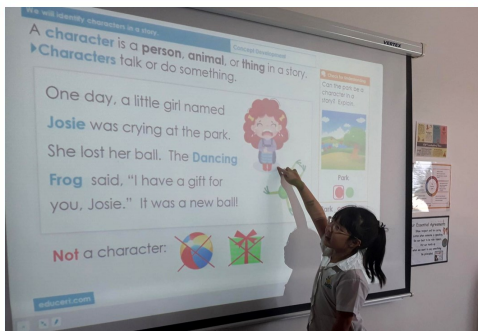
## MY: Our aesthetics unit

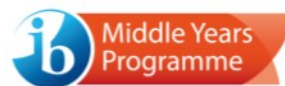


## Thai language cafe on Monday 6 November
